# **Archives**

### Research access, collection management and recent acquisitions

- Researcher numbers and items used are steady and within normal range.
- Research use several Visiting Fellows from the Australian Studies Institute working on women and wine and biography of Mavis Robertson; Australian War Memorial researchers using Burns Philp records to trace individuals on Honour Roll; 1980s journalists' strike
- Papers of Gareth Evans, Bill Bowtell and Mavis Robertson have been made ready for research use
- A substantial collection (5 palettes of smoke-affected records) of ACT Branch Construction Forestry Mining and Energy Union (CFMEU) from 1925 to 2016 have been processed
- The cataloguing of records from Manchester Unity Independent Order of Oddfellows NSW dating from 1849-2018 means most collections of Friendly Society records are more accessible for researchers
- Major acquisition of AMP (Australian Mutual Provident) archives recently received has been processed by Rachel Armstrong and ready for research use. Over 1600 items including business records and correspondence, staff cards, annual reports, advertising material, photographs and audio-visual recordings dating from 1849 to 2019
- Papers from Honorary Associate Professor Bryant Allen relating to Papua New Guinea, human geography and agriculture are a notable addition to the Pacific Research Archive
- Digitised archives have been added to JSTOR <u>Collections</u>

#### Exhibitions, outreach, external relations

- Marie Reay in Papua New Guinea: Exploring Cultures Through Objects, an exhibition in conjunction with the School of Archaeology and Anthropology on display in Menzies foyer and Marie Reay archival material on display in Chifley library
- Hiroshima, Nagasaki and the Atomic Bomb exhibition from the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, hosted by the Japan Institute and Menzies Library opened 5 September. The exhibition is supplemented by displays of peace and nuclear disarmament movement material from the Archives and a range of library publications on Hiroshima and nuclear warfare
- Official 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration closed with event for a time capsule to be held in the Archives for 25 years.
- Exhibition associated with 75<sup>th</sup> on student life on display in Noel Butlin Archives Centre will be available online soon
- Australian Association for Pacific Studies conference 2023 will be held at ANU. Archives, Menzies Asia and Pacific collections, Pacific Manuscripts Bureau and PARADESIC have submitted joint proposals for participation


