

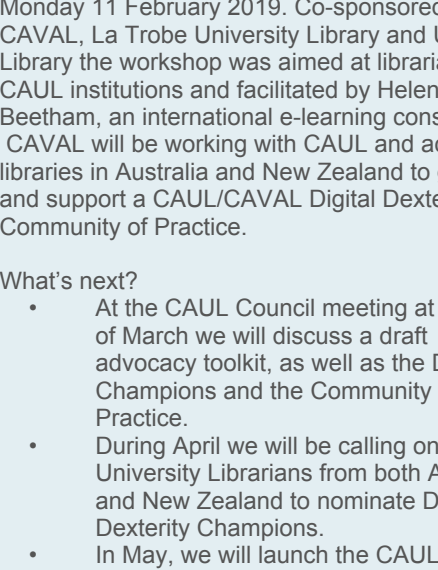

What's next? At the CAUL Council meeting at the end of March we will discuss a draft advocacy toolkit, as well as the DigiDex Champions and the Community of Practice.

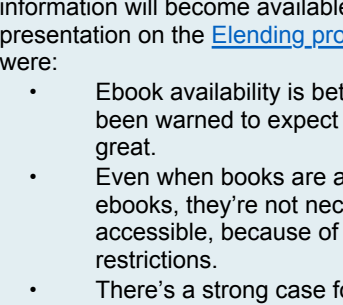
During April we will be calling on University Librarians from both Australia and New Zealand to nominate Digital Dexterity Champions.

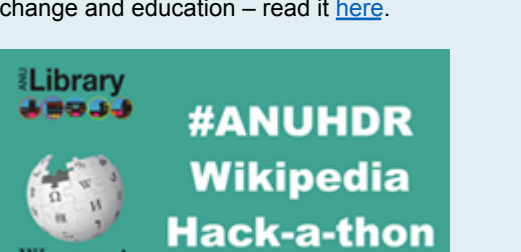

European copyright legislation passes - critics say it could hand more power to tech giants, stifle the free flow of information, and kill our beloved memes

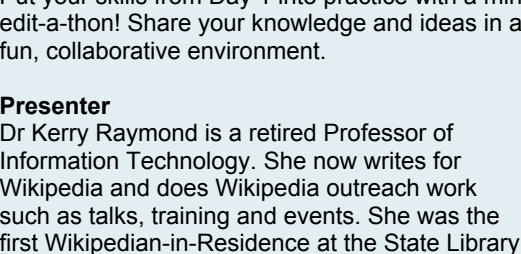

MIT Open access task force report. The report is quite inspirational and sets the science for a strong policy framework with excellent academic engagement.

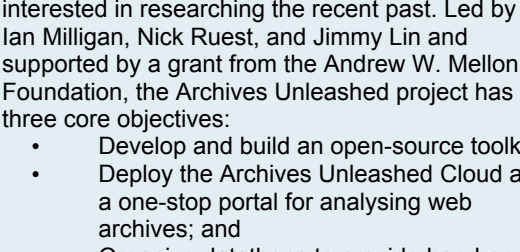

CARL Statement on the Role of the University Librarian. The Canadian Association of Research Libraries (CARL) has released a statement on the role of the University Librarian.

National Archives of Australia Check Up. In 2018 the National Archives of Australia (the National Archives) commissioned ORIMA Research to conduct an annual information management survey.

Scholarly publishing - some new articles. Potential predatory journals are colonizing the ICMJE recommendations list of followers.

US Academic Libraries That Spent the Most on Subscriptions. Twenty-two public universities and 18 four-year private nonprofit colleges spent more than \$10 million on subscriptions to scholarly journals and other serial titles in 2016-17.

The Library is the Brand. Very thought provoking - includes "If you are considering a similar effort at your institution, here are some steps you can take to increase the visibility of your library to your patrons through improved library branding:

Restructuring Library Collaboration. From Ithaka S+R - based on interviews and other research the report reaches many points that are worth reflecting on including - every good idea does not require a new organisation.

Impactful Scholarship and Metrics Framework. Also from ACRL - aims to produce an ACRL framework designed to address gaps between current scholarly evaluation practices and impactful scholarly activities within academic librarianship.

Project outcome for academic libraries. From ACRL - a FREE online toolkit designed to help libraries understand and share the impact of essential library programs and services.

A Library manifesto for Europe. They are from IFLA - Librarians matter for Europe - they are key venues for learning and civic engagement.

Harvard sued over licensing slave photos. A report in USA today - In 1850, Harvard University Professor Louis Agassiz commissioned what are believed to be the earliest daguerreotypes of American slaves.
