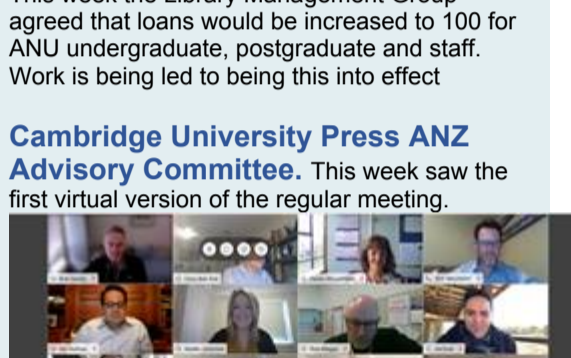

Great work at Hancock. From Samantha Jackson:

The work we started during the work from home period has finally been completed, and now all regular monographs and large books moved from Hancock to the Print Repository are updated in Sierra.

There was a process of taking the books identified as part of a series (ie the "green highlights" on our flagging lists) off the Sierra update lists. Almost 2000 records had to be removed manually, and Cathy did the bulk of this task. Jo then undertook the rapid updates to change the locations. A big thanks to both of them.

Thanks to the whole team for helping to identify the books that were to stay while we did our flagging – your accuracy and care in that task meant we were able to get the record changes right.

No doubt there are some books that snuck out to Hume despite our checking, but these will be a minority and we will fix them as we find them. Going forward, any books that say they are at Hancock but aren't on the shelves should be treated as a regular missing book.

Next will be the serials record changes, strategy and timelines to come.

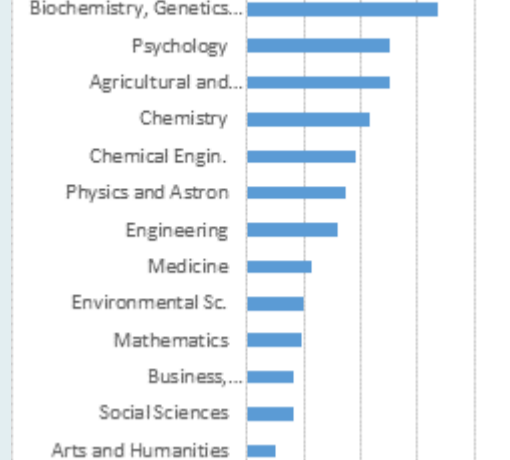

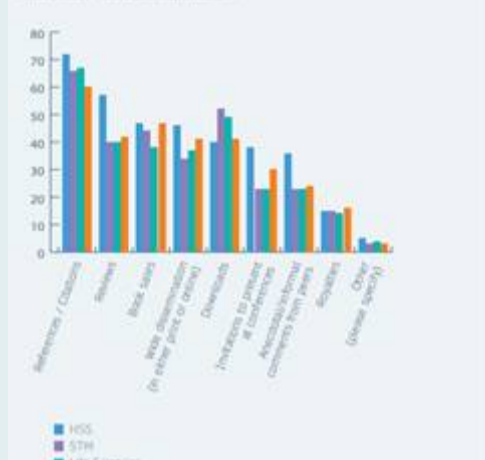

How do authors measure success of their book by discipline? Please select all that apply (n=4,375)

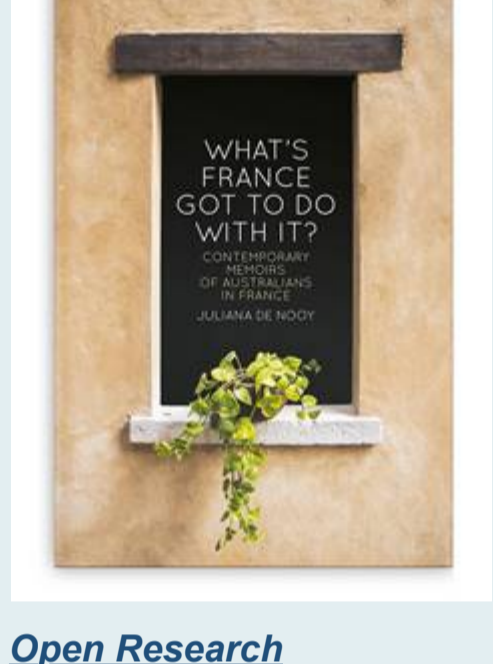
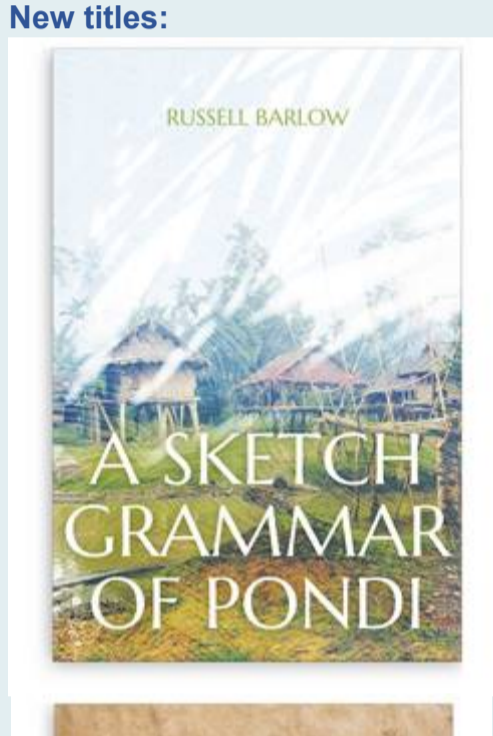
HSS author value references/citations and reviews, Life Sciences & STM authors put relatively more value on downloads
