TEQSA has published a <u>handy list</u> outlining some of the ways that authors can tell whether the journal you are considering is legitimate.

MIT Press opens full list of 2022 monographs via Direct to Open

<u>MIT Press</u> will publish its full list of 2022 scholarly monographs and edited collections open access on the <u>MIT Press Direct platform</u>.

Thirty-seven of the 80 works are already openly available to readers around the world. 240 libraries from around the globe committed to support Direct to Open (DTO).

Central European University Press removes frontlist from DDA

Central European University Press will no longer make its frontlist ebooks (currently 2020-2022) available through Demand-Driven Acquisition. This update will take effect July 31, 2022 and affects a total of 38 titles.

cOAlition S transformative agreement report

cOAlition S has released a report analysing the first year of the Transformative Journal (TJ) program. The report shows that more than half (56%) of the 2,304 journals in the program did not meet their first-year OA targets.

The coalition has extended its requirements another year, keeping all TJs in the program (although they must meet year 2 targets calculated as if the journal had met its year 1 numbers).

The Open Road Under Construction

The Library Journal (LJ) 2022 Open Access/Open Educational Resources Survey, sponsored by SirsiDynix finds that the use and visibility of open access (OA) content collections and open educational resources (OER) appear to be changing at colleges and universities. Seventy-eight percent answered that they were somehow involved in curating OA and OER collections.

Greener Publishing Guide

Australian Publishers Association has launched the <u>Greener Publishing Guide</u> as an introduction to current best practice, and to prompt further industry discussion and collaboration on environmental sustainability.

Accelerating Social Impact Research: Libraries at the Intersection of Openness and Community-Engaged Scholarship

The Association of Research Libraries (ARL) has published the first <u>report</u> of a six-month pilot cohort program from 2021, <u>Accelerating the Social Impact of Research (ASIR)</u>.

National Cultural Policy



Valuable Data Collections Retained With \$2 million Boost

Data collections of national significance held at universities, research institutions and national research infrastructure facilities across Australia have been secured for future research thanks to a \$2 million coinvestment by the ARDC.

Through Phase 1 of the ARDC's Data Retention Program, the ARDC co-invested \$2 million and our partners co-invested similar funds to directly support over 27 petabytes of valuable national data collections.

Library Impact Research Report: Faculty Publication Patterns at a Large Urban University and Correlation with Collections Use and Size

As part of ARL's Research Library Impact Framework initiative, the University of Illinois Chicago (UIC) conducted a study to demonstrate how the availability and use of library collections impacts faculty productivity and publication patterns over time.

To address these questions, the project used various statistics: collection size (measured by journal holdings), collection use (measured by number of references in the publications), number of publications by faculty, publication impact (measured by number of citations), number of co-authors, grant funding, page counts, and faculty demographic information.
