

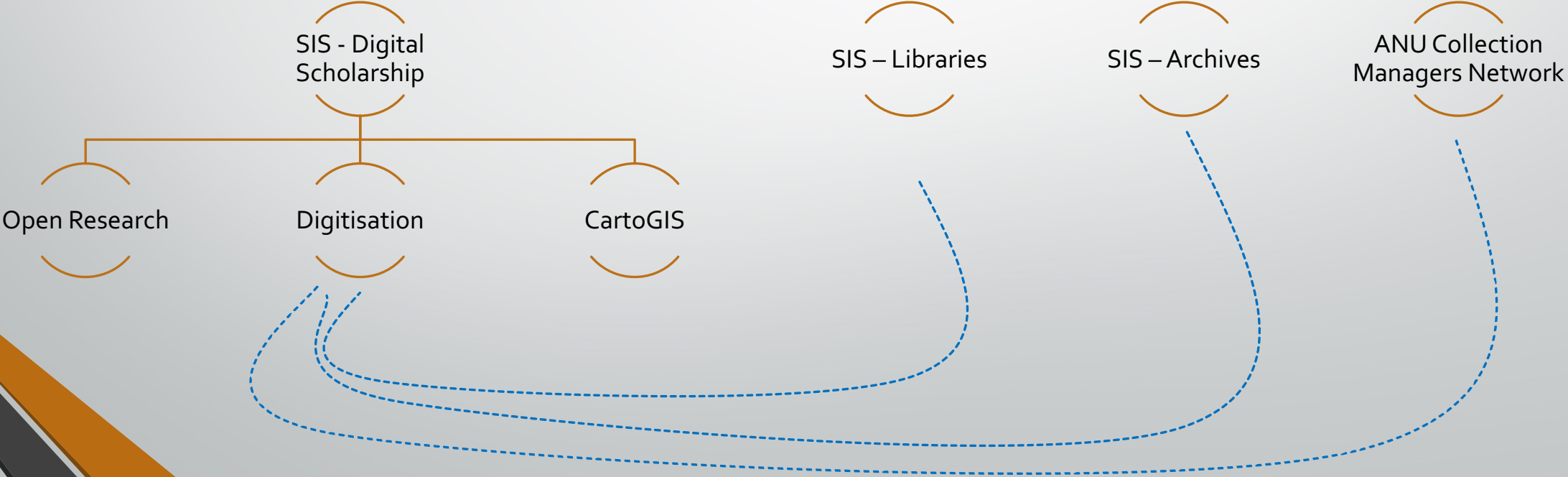

In-house Digitisation Capabilities

- Flat Bed Scanning – Photographs, Documents, Books, Maps, Manuscript
- Audio Digitisation – Audiocassettes

Treventus 2.0 Robotic Scanner

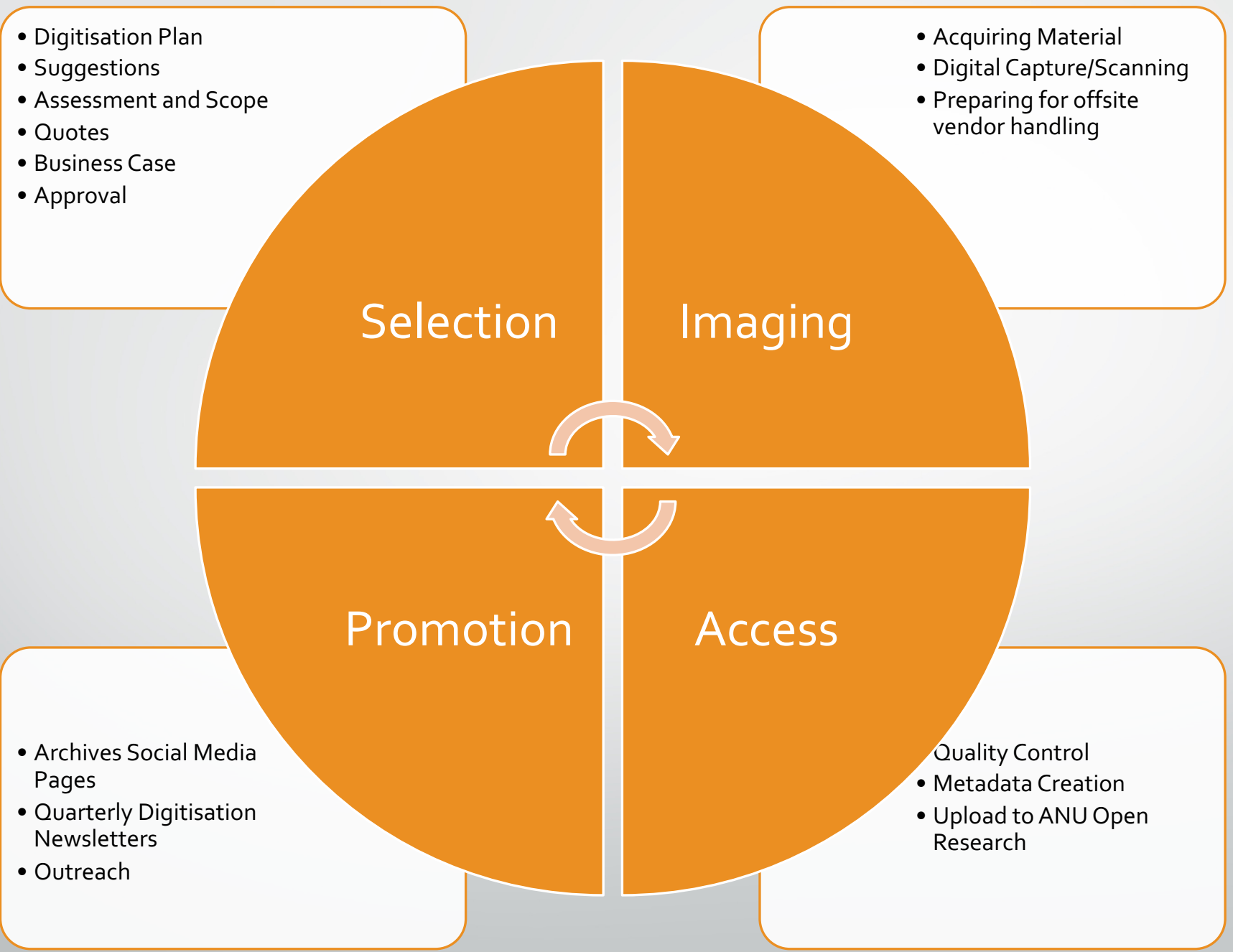
- Moved from now-defunct UPS to Menzies – June 2022
- Capable of scanning 2500 pages per hour
- Batch computer suite for image processing, page processing, OCR, and quality control workflows



Photolab

- Installed in the Menzies dark rooms in April 2022
- Canon 5D SLR with Sigma 50mm f1.4 DG HSM Art Lens
- Scans oversize documents, large maps and plans, fragile material





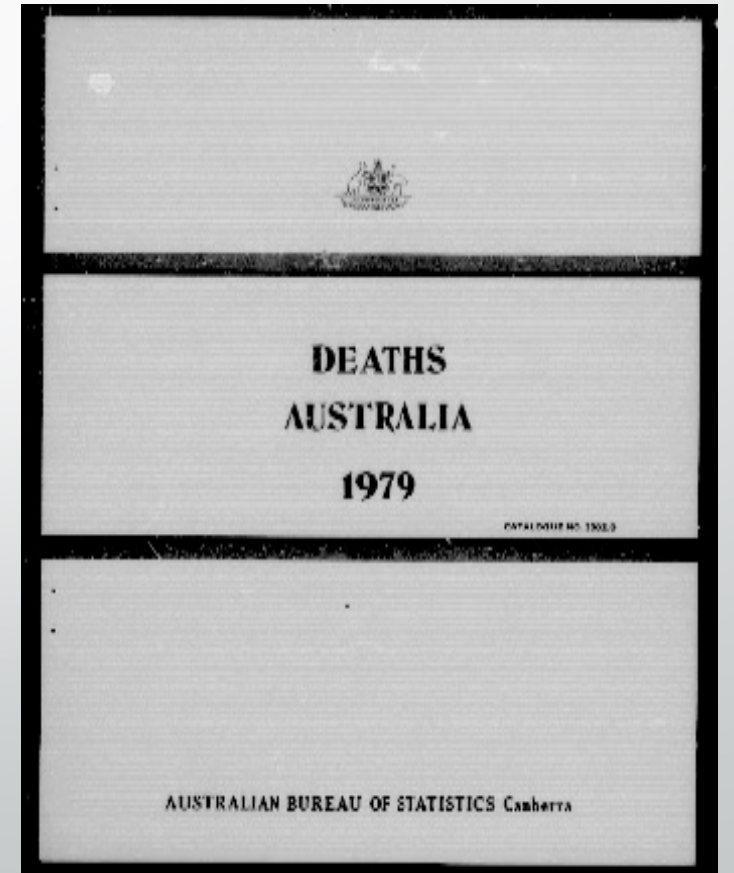
Kessler Maps

AV Digitisation Project

- Started as a request for preservation of ethnographic AV material

- The largest AV project at SIS-Digitisation to date





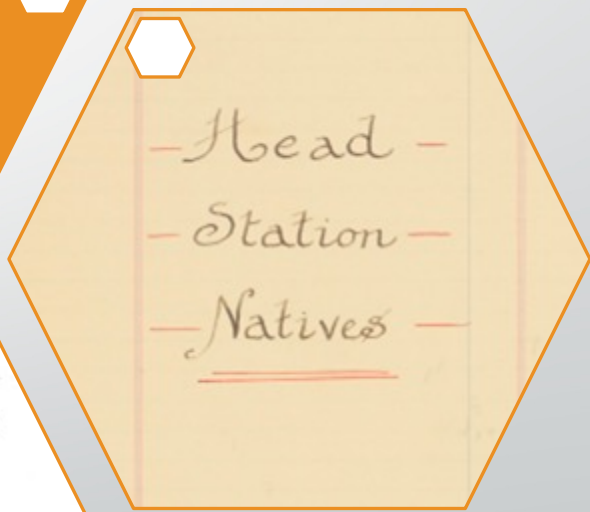
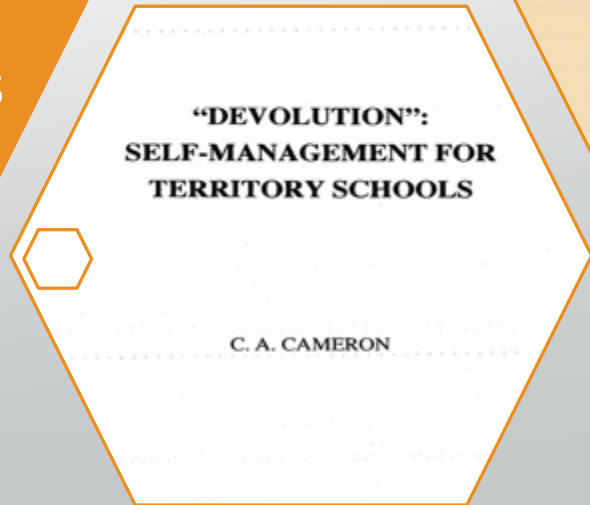


Photogrammetry Workshop

- Full attendance including staff and students




DSpace Upgrade
